Emeritus Professor of Psychiatry, University of Pittsburgh, age 79, of Fox Chapel, Pennsylvania, passed away on Friday, November 24, 2017. Born in Detroit, Michigan to A. Joseph Himmelhoch, M.D. and Sarah Jane (Simmons) Himmelhoch. Predeceased by his sister, Martha Emily; and his brother, S. Ralph (H'57). Beloved (occasionally challenging) husband of Judith E.
