Alternatively, register using the enclosed Registration Form and mail with a check or credit card payment to 45th Reunion Office, 124 Mt. Auburn Street, 6th Floor, Cambridge, MA 02138 (or fax to 617-495-0434). The Class treasury may be able to help those who would otherwise be unable to attend the Reunion because of the cost. Contact any of the Reunion co-chairs if you have financial aid needs.

To help us in making final arrangements, please have your registration and payment in by September 2. As an incentive, getting it in to us by that date gets you a discount.

We hope you will attend the whole Reunion (Thursday evening, September 29, through Sunday brunch, October 2). But there are three choices: to register for the whole Reunion; to register for the first half of the Reunion (Thursday evening through Friday); or, to register for the second half of the Reunion (Saturday through Sunday brunch).

Continental breakfast followed by 9:00 a.m. interview/conversation with Bob Rubin '60, former co-CEO of Goldman Sachs, former head of the National Economic Council in the Clinton White House, Secretary of the Treasury 1995-1999, and currently director and chair of the Executive Committee of Citigroup and one of the seven members of the Harvard Corporation. Bob looks forward to a chance to greet classmates and to respond to questions about foreign and domestic issues facing the nation, about his time with the Clinton administration, about Harvard today, and about anything else.

Interviewing Bob will be '60 classmate Paul Kirk, a retired partner of Sullivan & Worcester. Paul is a director of several corporations and nonprofits, chair of the Overseers' committee to visit the Department of Athletics, and former chair of the Overseers' nominating committee. He is co-chair of the Commission on Presidential Debates, chairman of the board of the John F. Kennedy Library Foundation, and former chairman of the national Democratic Party.
